Career Program

Beginning with the 2020-2021 school year, Naviance will be introduced to all 8th through 12th grade students. Career services are provided to all students. Students receive career education information, advice on appropriate courses to take, and opportunities to take advanced placement courses. Students complete career interest inventories, participate in college/career fairs, participate in job shadowing opportunities, prepare resumes, and visit industries.

Follow-up with Graduates and Students At Risk of Dropping Out

Yellville-Summit School District has a tracks potential and actual school dropouts through email, phone calls, and face to face meetings. At-risk students are identified by poor and failing grades, excessive absenteeism, lack of parental involvement, and excessive disciplinary actions. These students are monitored by CAP Advisors and building principal. They are offered counseling services (school counselor then SBMH agency on campus), alternative education (YS Digital Learning or RISE Academy), before and after school 21C programs and tutoring to increase academic, social/personal, engagement and behavior achievement.
